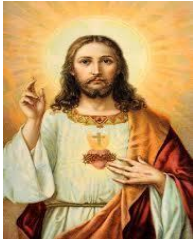

## The Miraculous catch of Fish



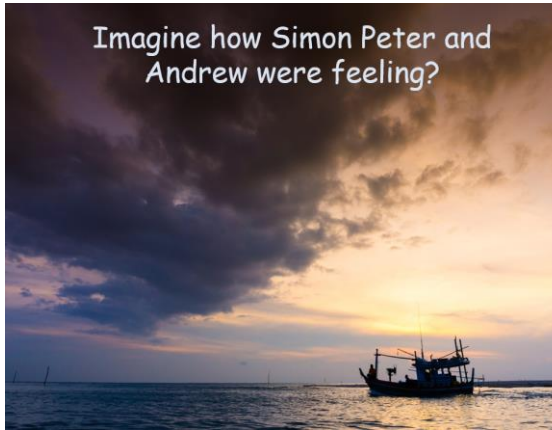
### A very difficult task

The teacher comes along and tells you to start all over again. How would you feel?

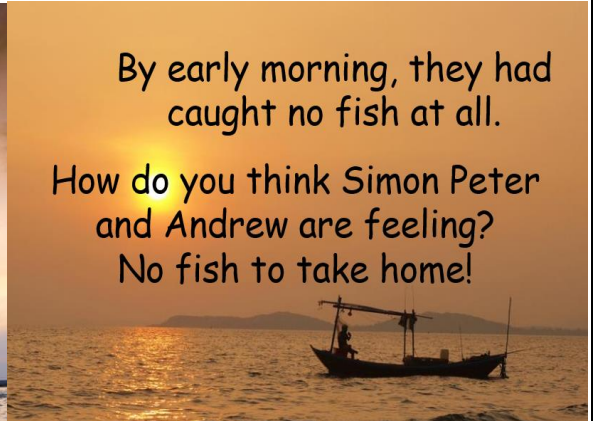
It was a little bit like this for Simon Peter and Andrew. They had been fishing all night long and caught nothing.

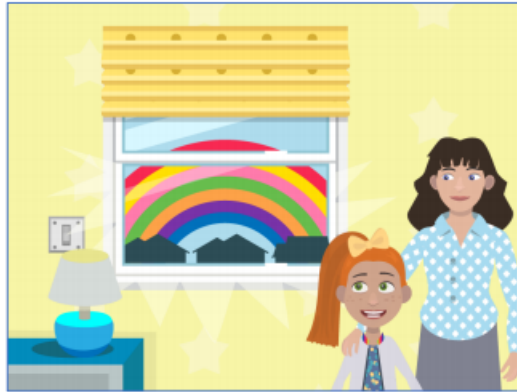
