
Year Six Home Learning Pack Spring Four Part 1

Competition Week 1 (22-28 Feb)

Competition Week 2 (1-7 Mar)








Time to practice modal verbs, remember these are verbs that tell you how possible or certain some thing is.

We go swimming on Friday.




